

Management of Effluent on places subject to movement control as part of the *Mycoplasma bovis* Response

No permit is required for movement of effluent off properties that are under movement control Notice of Direction (s122 movement control NOD) or Restricted Place Notice.

Our guidelines that have been reviewed and revised to reflect the risk and risk rating reassessment (October 2018) and the Organism Management Specifications C&D V2.0

No specific cleaning and disinfectant processes are required for effluent, effluent tanks, effluent ponds, irrigated effluent and areas irrigated by effluent as they are considered an extremely low transmission risk.

There is no stand-down period required following application of effluent to grazing pasture or ensiling of pasture. Areas irrigated with effluent do not require any cleaning and disinfection and are considered an extremely low transmission risk.

Solid faeces and effluent are an extremely low transmission risk, so no cleaning and disinfection process is required as part of the *Mycoplasma bovis* response.

Observe usual local requirements and environmental considerations when removing organic waste from transport vehicles, effluent tanks and transfer of organic material from ponds if required.

Note: bulk organic matter such as effluent and soil **cannot** be disinfected with chemicals.
